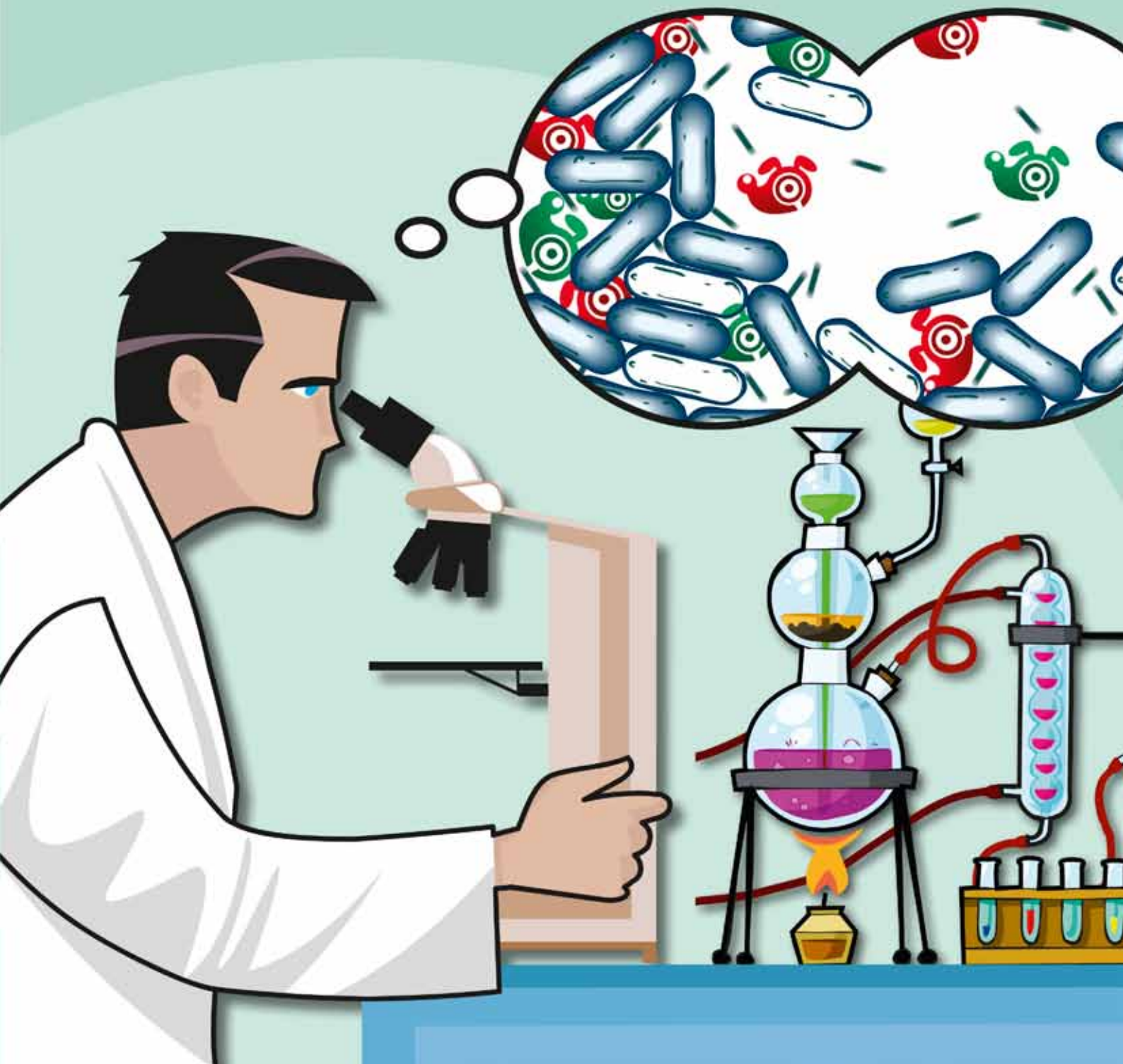

STEPHEN DIBARTOLA

Dr. DiBartola received his DVM degree from the University of California, Davis in 1976. He completed an internship in Small Animal Medicine and Surgery at Cornell University in Ithaca, New York in June 1977. He was Assistant Professor of Medicine at the College of Veterinary Medicine, University of Illinois from July 1979 until August 1981. In August 1981, Dr. DiBartola returned to the Department of Veterinary Clinical Sciences at the Ohio State University. He was promoted to Associate Professor in 1985 and to Professor in 1990. He received the Norden Distinguished Teaching Award in 1988 and completed a textbook entitled Fluid Therapy in Small Animal Practice first published by W.B. Saunders Co. in 1992. The fourth edition of this book was published in 2011. Dr. DiBartola currently serves as co-editor-in-chief for the Journal of Veterinary Internal Medicine. Dr. DiBartola's clinical areas of interest include diseases of the kidney and fluid, acid base, and electrolyte disturbances. His areas of research interest include reactive systemic amyloidosis and two familial renal diseases of cats: familial amyloidosis of Abyssinian cats and autosomal dominant polycystic kidney disease in Persian cats.



MAXEY WELLMAN

Dr. Wellman received her DVM degree from The Ohio State University in 1978. She completed a combined clinical pathology residency and PhD from The Ohio State University in 1986. Dr. Wellman became an Assistant Professor in 1987, an Associate Professor in 1989, and a Professor in 2010. She received the Carl Norden-Pfizer Distinguished Teacher Award in 2006. She served on the Executive Board of the American Society for Veterinary Clinical Pathologists and was President of this organization in 1998. She currently is the President-elect for the American College of Veterinary Pathologists and the Section Head for the Clinical Laboratories in the Veterinary Medical Center at The Ohio State University. She is the Cytology/Surgical Pathology Section Editor for Veterinary Clinical Pathology. Her areas of interest are hematology, cytology, diseases involving large granular lymphocytes, histiocytic disorders, the bone marrow microenvironment, and regenerative medicine.



HILDE DE COCK

Dr Hilde De Cock received her degree in Veterinary Medicine in 1990 from Ghent University, Belgium. Soon after graduation she started her career in veterinary pathology, first at the Department of Veterinary Pathology at the Ghent University, followed in 1996 by a two year residency in anatomical veterinary pathology at the VMTH, UC Davis, California, USA. After completing the program she received a fellowship at the Department of Pathology, Microbiology and Immunology at UC Davis. The next year (1999) she successfully took the ACVP pathology board exam and became Diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Pathologists. In 2001 she finished her Ph.D. at the Department of Veterinary Pathology at the Ghent University. Meanwhile she gained experience in diagnostic veterinary pathology at Idexx laboratories (West Sacramento) and as lecturer at the VMTH, UC Davis, USA. In 2006 she returned to Belgium and founded her own business in veterinary pathology (Veterinary Pathology Services, bvba) which works in close collaboration with Medvet (AML) medical lab.



DELPHINE CRIEL

Delphine Criel graduated as veterinarian in 2003 at the University of Ghent, where she subsequently performed an internship in small animal medicine. After working in private practice for 5 years, she joined AML-Medvet (veterinary medical laboratory) as clinical pathologist. Because of her keen interest in internal medicine, she completed the ESAVS small animal internal medicine course at Utrecht in 2012. She also spent six weeks at UC Davis, where she was welcomed by the clinical pathology service to be trained in veterinary cytology. Her goal is to expand her knowledge in clinical pathology through continuing education. The free time that is left is dedicated to her family and music.
